All eyes right now are on these Capital campaign committees, as they meet, discuss and plan the raising of funds for our remodeling and transitional care addition!




Ways To Give To The Capital Campaign

GIFTS OF CASH
 Gifts of cash to a qualified charity are 100% tax deductible up to 50% of a giver's adjusted gross income. Should the gift amount be in excess of the 50% limit, the gift may be deducted in as many as five succeeding years.

Foundation. **Remember:** Do not sell the stock prior to making a gift!
Prior to initiating any stock transactions you must contact Val Walker, Campaign Consultant, at 612/230-3337 or visit the Foundation website at www.mnumf.org. It is the policy of the Foundation that gifts of appreciated stock will be redeemed immediately upon receipt. The Foundation will not be responsible for any losses that occur on these transactions.

Health Center as both the owner and beneficiary of the policy. Your premium payments are tax deductible. If the policy is paid up, your charitable contribution is generally the replacement value or cost basis of the policy, whichever is less. Premiums paid on a gifted life insurance policy also qualify for deductions.



GIFTS OF APPRECIATED STOCK

Gifts of securities and other appreciated assets owned more than one year have a double tax benefit. First, there is a charitable deduction for the full market value and second, it avoids the capital gains tax. Some may choose to give gifts of appreciated stock because of the associated tax benefits. This may be done through your stockbroker, or you can contact the Minnesota United Methodist Foundation for assistance. There is no fee for this service through the

GIFTS OF REAL ESTATE
 Real estate can be an outstanding gift to a capital campaign if the process is started in time. When all gifting conditions are met, real estate gifts are also tax advantaged. They bypass both capital gains and standard depreciation recapture and the donor receives a charitable deduction for the full appraised value.

As baby boomers reach retirement age, Minnesota's senior population will double. It is going to take the combined efforts of all of us - family members, friends, legislators and communities-to ensure a high quality of life for our oldest citizens.

Face Aging MN is a statewide campaign to raise awareness about the issues that we are facing as our society ages.

Here are our priorities for preserving quality of life for aging Minnesotans.

1. Older adults should live independently for as long as they are able, in communities that provide them with love and support.
2. Families should work with their healthcare professionals to plan for the future so their loved ones will receive a continuum of care as they grow older.
3. The State of Minnesota should take the steps needed to ensure that all aging Minnesotans will receive safe and quality care from experienced caregivers.
4. Senior care organizations and the State of Minnesota should be encouraged to find more innovative and efficient ways to provide services to aging Minnesotans and their families.

Here are the facts:

- At least 60,000 Minnesotans will turn 65 every year for the next 15 years. That's like a new city the size of Lakeville springing up every year, populated entirely by seniors.
- By 2030, 25% of Minnesota adults will be age 65 or older. Of those seniors, more than 55,000 will be age 90 or older.
- Over the next decade, we will need another 25,000 professional caregivers in Minnesota in large part to care for our growing senior population.


A Heart Healthy Future At Lakeview Methodist

Lakeview is happy to announce that we are working closely with the Mayo Clinic Health System on a Congestive Heart Failure (CHF) readmission program.

What we are trying to really focus on is not having our residents in and out of the hospital and managing their chronic illnesses here at Lakeview.



Working closely with Adria Whiting, Nurse Practitioner, along with Dr. Jeffery Green, medical director at Lakeview Methodist and other physicians at Mayo Clinic Health Systems. Residents that are admitted to Lakeview Methodist after a hospital stay with a diagnosis of CHF will be followed weekly by Adria Whiting for four weeks, then monthly for 6 months along with additional education with the nursing staff in regard to CHF management particularly in the long term care setting.






